

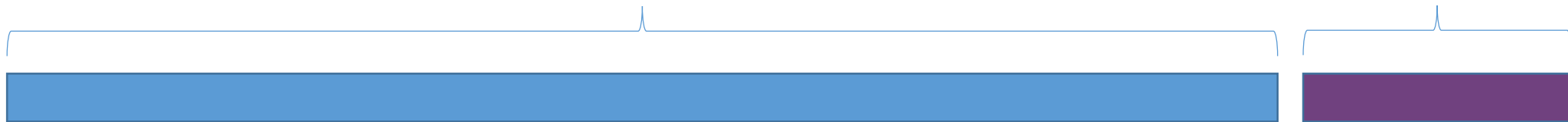
Additional Days School Year TSDS Changes (2020-2021 School Year)

HB 3: Additional Days for Elementary

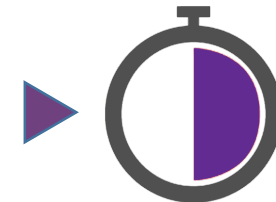
HB 3 adds **half-day formula funding** for school systems that want to add instructional days (beyond a minimum 180 days, **up to 210 days**) to any of their elementary schools (grades **PK-5**).

Minimum 180 Instructional Days

Up to 30 Additional Days



Half-day formula funding



Sample Financial Impact Scenario

Clarifying Minutes vs Days Requirement

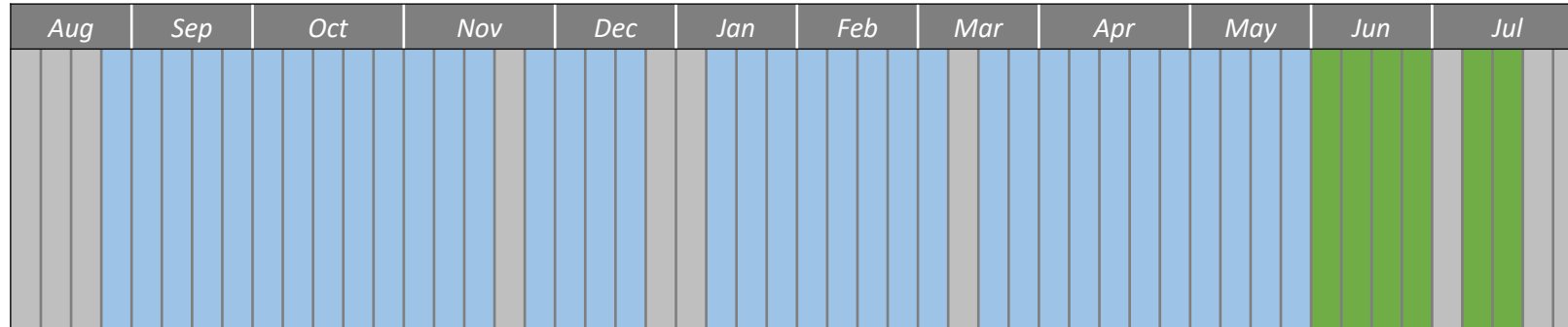
The HB 3 statute requires participating districts to meet both the 75,600 minutes requirement and have 180 days of instruction.

	Existing Academic Calendar	180 Days + Up to 30 Additional Days
School System Requirements	75,600 minutes	75,600 minutes + 180 days <i>(waivers do not count towards days)</i>

Given the HB 3 statutory requirement, TEA is referring to the 180 days for the implementation of ADSY. Campuses not implementing additional days are not impacted by this requirement.

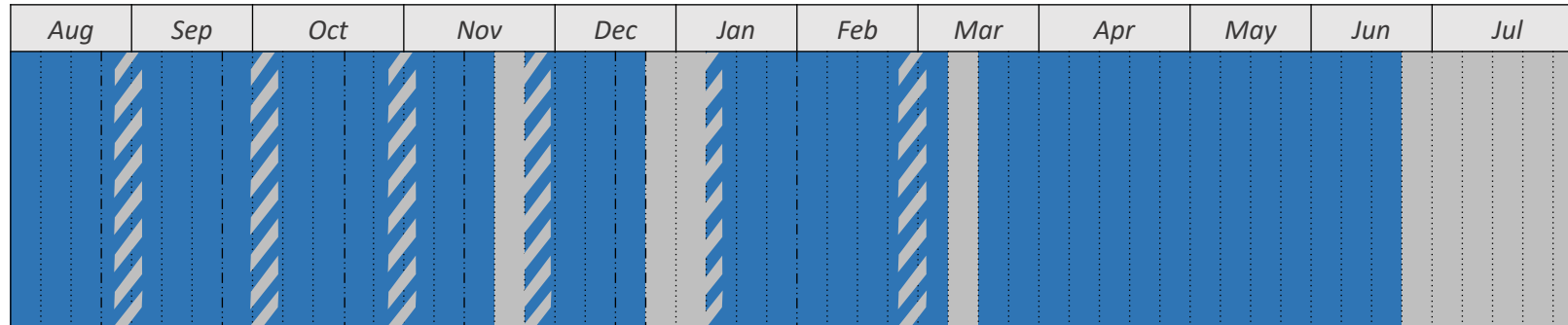
Implementation Options

Option 1



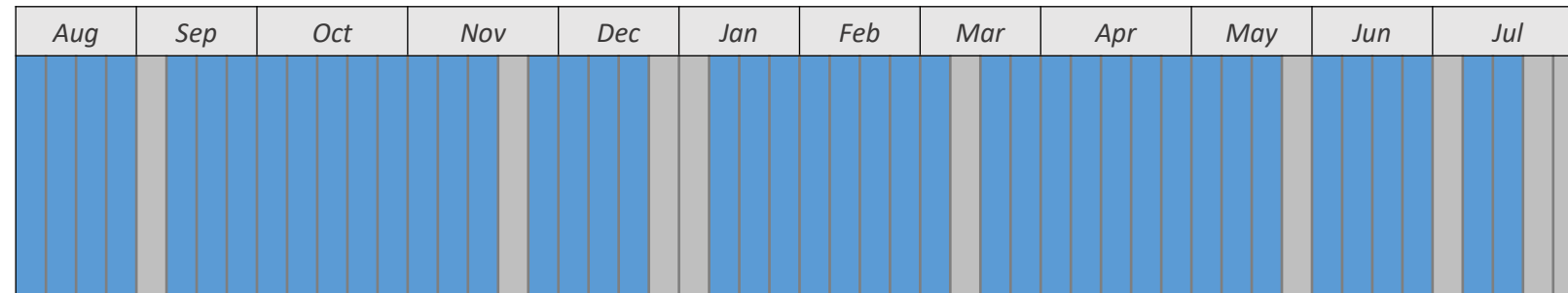
- All Students Attend
- Summer Programming (ADSY Days)
- Breaks >2 days

Option 2



- All Students Attend
- Remediation (ADSY Days)
Subset of students attend
- Breaks >2 days

Option 3



- All Students Attend (Includes 30 ADSY Days)
- Breaks >2 days

Statute Components Affecting Implementation



Calendar Design

- 180-day base-calendar requirement, up-to 30 distinct additional days
- Start date / District of Innovation changes
- Two required bad weather make-up days
- Minimum of two hours of instruction for ADSY days
- September 1, 2020 start date



Non-Compulsory Attendance

- Non-compulsory attendance for additional days
[Texas Education Code Sec. 25.085\(i\)](#)



Campus-level

- Participating **campuses** must be at 180 days
- Additional Days School Year can have a subset of students attend



Certified Instructors

- Teachers teaching the two hours of instruction must be certified
- All other components of the TEC apply aside from non-compulsory attendance
