Overview

- Updated the definition and data element reporting requirements for the ADDITIONAL-DAYS-PROGRAM-INDICATOR-CODE (E1671) data element.
- Updated the SchoolExtension complex type to include the ADDITIONAL-DAYS-PROGRAM-INDICATOR-CODE (E1671) data element, to be reported as Optional in the PEIMS Summer Submission.
- The Learning Support and Programs Division can determine the calendars that fall short of the required 180 days or 75,600 minutes, including approved waiver minutes/days.



- Overview cont.
 - The Learning Support and Programs Division can provide outreach to campuses between the PEIMS Summer First Submission and Resubmission to allow for any needed data corrections.
 - TEA will create a new report at the statewide level and a new report at the LEA level, both reports will be available the first week in May. New rules will be added, in the March 31, 2023, release, to reflect the collection of the indicator during the PEIMS Summer Submission.

Updated Data Element Reporting Requirements:

Data Element Reporting Requirements

ADDITIONAL-DAYS-PROGRAM-INDICATOR-CODE (E1671) indicates whether the campus offers implemented an Additional Days School Year program for any students in prekindergarten through fifth grades as described in TEC Sec. 48.0051. The ADDITIONAL-DAYS-PROGRAM-INDICATOR-CODE is reported only for PEIMS submissions 3 and 4.

The instruction for an ADSY program can be provided on different campus. For example, a Local Education Agency (LEA) has two elementary schools. Elementary #101 has implemented an after school ADSY program. The students are transported to Elementary #102 to receive instruction after school. Elementary #101 must meet the ADSY calendar requirements.

For PEIMS Summer submission (Sub 3):

The ADDITIONAL-DAYS-PROGRAM-INDICATOR-CODE is reported to indicate any campus that has students participating in the Additional Days School Year Program. Between the first PEIMS Summer submission and resubmission, TEA will verify the reported calendar data to ensure the campus meets the minimum ADSY calendar requirements.

For PEIMS Extended Year submission (Sub 4):

Report all relevant ADSY program data.

Overview

- TEA currently collects dyslexia related services information during the PEIMS Summer Submission. During the PEIMS Fall Submission, TEA collects data indicating if a student is identified as dyslexic under TEC 48.009.
- During the PEIMS Summer Submission, TEA collects the type of dyslexia or related services, if any, a student identified with dyslexia or related disorder under TEC §48.009 has received at any time during the school year. However, TEA does not collect an indicator to validate that each student identified as dyslexic has been reported with the services received.



- Overview cont.
 - Additionally, local education agencies (LEAs) are required to screen students in kindergarten and first grade for dyslexia or related disorders. Currently, when an LEA does not screen a student, TEA cannot identify why the screening did not take place.
 - The division of special education has requested changes to what is collected for dyslexic students.

Added Data Element Reporting Requirements:

DYSLEXIA-SCREENING-EXCEPTION-REASON (EXXXX) indicates the reason a student in kindergarten or first grade was not screened for dyslexia or related disorders.

DYSLEXIA-SCREENING-EXCEPTION-REASON is only reported and must be reported for students in kindergarten and first grade who have not been screened for dyslexia or related disorders (DYSLEXIA-RISK-CODE of "03").

Some reason codes provide an acceptable reason a student was not screened during the dyslexia screening window, whereas other reason codes provide an unacceptable reason a student was not screened during the dyslexia screening window. The dyslexia screening window for kindergarten falls between the first and last instructional days of the school year, and for first grade students the dyslexia screening window starts the first instructional day of the school year and ends on January 31st.

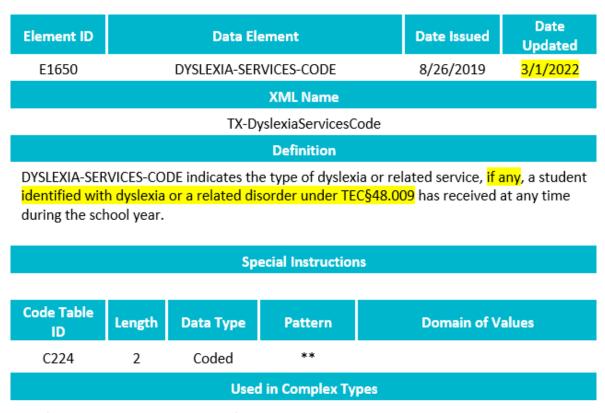

The TX-DyslexiaService Complex Type represents which types of dyslexia or related services, if any, a student identified with dyslexia or a related disorder under TEC§48.009 has received at any time during the school year.

DYSLEXIA-SERVICES-CODE (E1650) indicates the type of dyslexia or related services, if any, a student identified with dyslexia or a related disorder under TEC§48.009 has received at any time during the school year.

More than one DYSLEXIA-SERVICES-CODE may be reported for each student. In XML reporting, this is known as "unbounded" and allows an XML item to be repeated as many times as needed, as shown:

Overview

House Bill 22 (HB 22), passed during the 85th legislative session, established the A-F accountability system. Per TEC §39.053, students can earn College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) credit for earning an approved industry-based certification (IBC). Additionally, House Bill 3 (HB 3), passed during the 86th legislative session, entitles LEAs to one IBC reimbursement per student to help defray the cost of the exams passed.



- Overview cont.
 - Currently, LEAs use the data element, POST-SECONDARY-LICENSURE-CERTIFICATION-CODE (E1640) to report IBCs earned for CCMR credit (students have earned the certification) and IBCs passed (students have passed all or a portion of a multileveled certification). TEA uses this data element to determine whether a student has met the threshold to earn the CCMR indicator, and data element IBC-EXAM-FEE-AMOUNT (E1654) to determine if the LEA is requesting reimbursement. LEAs may request reimbursement for a portion of an IBC exam a student passed, even if the student has not completed all the requirements to earn the certification.



- Overview cont.
 - Additionally, the 2018-2019 school year was the last year TEA collected when a student failed an IBC exam. While the LEA cannot request reimbursement for those students who fail to pass an IBC exam, TEA must collect this information for reporting purposes.

**TX-IndustryCertifications

The TX-IndustryCertifications Complex Type represents the industry-based certification(s) as student has passed and earned for the purposes of the College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) indicator, passed all or a portion of a multileveled certification for reimbursement, and/or failed an industry-based certification examination received. This information is used by Performance Reporting for use in the College, Career, and Military Readiness CCMR components of the academic accountability system.

The TX-IndustryCertifications Complex Type provides information on the examinations taken by a student during a school year. The TX-IndustryCertifications Complex Type includes the following:

- Type of certification,
- Results of the examination, and
- If requesting reimbursement, the cost of examination to the Local Education Agency (LEA).

The TX IndustryCertification Complex Type represents a single industry-based certification (IBC) or license result that indicates whether a student has earned an IBC or license for the purposes of the CCMR indicator, either passed all or a portion of a multileveled certification, or earned for the purposes of the CCMR indicator received, or failed the certification exam.

More than one IBC may be reported for each student. For each unique-industry certification IBC or license examination taken by a student during a school year earned by a student while enrolled in a particular LEA, the complex type TX-IndustryCertifications will be reported. In the XML reporting, this is known as "unbounded" and allows an XML item or set of items to be repeated as many times as needed.

More than one industry certification may be reported for each student. For each unique industry certification exam passed, earned, or failed by a student while enrolled in a particular LEA, the complex type TX IndustryCertification will be reported. In the XML reporting, this is known as "unbounded" and allows an XML item or set of items to be repeated as many times as needed.

Effective dating is a method of tracking data changes over time. A new instance of the TX-IndustryCertifications Complex Type will be reported each time a student takes an IBC or license examination during the school year earns a post secondary industry certification or license. With each new instance of the complex type, a new date should be reported in the EFFECTIVE-DATE (TX-DateCertEarned).





Effective dating is a method of tracking data changes over time. A new instance of the TX IndustryCertification Complex Type will be reported each time a student earns an industry based certification or license, has passed all or a portion of a multileveled certification or has failed an industry based exam. With each new instance of the complex type a new date should be reported in the EFFECTIVE DATE (TX DateCertEarned).

EFFECTIVE-DATE (TX-DateCertEarned) (E1632) indicates the date upon which the associated data values(s) is/are considered to take effect, or the associated data value(s) change(s).

For the TX-IndustryCertifications Complex Type, the EFFECTIVE-DATE reflects the date the student takes an IBC or license examination during the school year. passed and earned an industry based certification, passed all or a portion of a multileveled certification, or failed the industry based certification exam. received the industry certification.





IBC-EXAM-FEE-AMOUNT (E1654) identifies the amount of money that was paid for a student's industry-based certification exam<mark>ination</mark> by the local education agency for which the local education agency is requesting reimbursement from TEA. Each student is entitled to one passed certification examination at state cost in grades 9-12, of which the LEA is entitled to a reimbursement from TEA for up to \$700.

TEA will reimburse the first reported IBC exam<mark>ination in PEIMS with an associated cost greater than \$0. Since only one reimbursement per student in grades 9-12 will be provided, LEAs should only report an IBC-EXAM-FEE-AMOUNT greater than \$0 for the certification for which they wish to be reimbursed. For any certification for which an LEA is not requesting reimbursement (for example, if they have already requested a reimbursement for the is student or the student failed the examination), the IBC-EXAM-FEE-AMOUNT either does not need to be reported or may be reported as \$0.00.</mark>

If an LEA reports more than one IBC-EXAM-FEE-AMOUNT for a student, the first certification examination passed or IBC earned with an amount greater than \$0 will be reimbursed. If there is more than one certification passed/earned within the same school year-on the same day that is reported with an amount greater than \$0, the higher amount will be reimbursed.

If multiple LEAs report an IBC-EXAM-FEE-AMOUNT for the same student, the first-LEA with the earliest EFFECTIVE-DATE (E1632) will be considered for reimbursement LEAs should utilize the TREx platform to minimize duplicate reporting. LEAs cannot request reimbursement for an IBC examination a student has failed.

For more information, refer to House Bill 3: Industry-Based Certification Reimbursements.

IBC-VENDOR-CODE (E1655) identifies the organization or company that offered the service.

For an industry certification or licensure, this is the vendor or organization that administered the certification exam. The vendor code must be reported for each certification exam taken.

The College, Career, and Military Preparation (CCMP) Division of TEA maintains the following list of Industry Certification exams crosswalked to the approved vendors providing the exam:

POST-SECONDARY-CERTIFICATION-LICENSURE-RESULT (E17XX) indicates the result of a state, nationally or internationally recognized IBC examination taken by a student.





Added Examples:

1. Examination Passed and CCMR Earned

- a. Student A took the Cisco Certified Design Associate examination and passed. There are no other components to this certification. The <u>student</u> has earned the IBC, may be awarded CCMR credit, and the LEA may request reimbursement.
- b. Student B completed all requirements to sit for the Phlebotomy Technician IBC. The student took the examination and passed. The <u>student</u> has earned the IBC, may be awarded CCMR credit and the LEA may request reimbursement.
- c. Student C completed all requirements to sit for the Phlebotomy Technician IBC. The student took the examination and failed. However, the student re-took the examination and passed. The student has earned the IBC, may be awarded CCMR credit and the LEA may request reimbursement.

2. Examination Passed but CCMR Not Earned

- a. Student D took the CompTIA A Plus examination, which consists of 220-1001 (Core 1) and 220-1002 (Core 2). The student *passed* 220-1001 (Core 1), but *failed* 220-1002 (Core 2). The student has <u>not</u> earned the IBC and may <u>not</u> be awarded CCMR credit; however, the LEA may request reimbursement for the CompTIA A+ 220-1001 (Core 1) examination and the LEA should report the IBC Examination Passed with a POST-SECONDARY-CERTIFICATION-LICENSURE-RESULT-CODE "02".
- b. Student E took the Non-Commissioned Security Officer Level II examination and passed but did not submit fingerprints for the required background check. The student has not earned the IBC and may not be awarded CCMR credit; however, the LEA may request reimbursement for the examination.

3. Examination Failed

a. Student F took the Wastewaters Collection IBC examination and failed. The LEA should report the result of the examination. The student may not be awarded CCMR credit and the LEA may not request reimbursement.

Overview

- During the 86th legislative session, Senate Bill (SB) 11 was passed, which amended Subchapter D, Chapter 37, TEC by adding §37.115. This new section requires the board of trustees for each LEA to establish a safe and supportive school program (SSSP) team to serve at each campus to conduct threat assessments. The SSSP team must report to the agency, through guidelines developed by the agency, the following information regarding the team's activities and other information for each LEA campus the team serves, the outcome of each assessment made by the team, including:
 - any disciplinary action taken, including a change in school placement (§37.115(k)(3)(A));
 - changes in school placement, including placement in a juvenile justice alternative education program or disciplinary alternative education program (§37.115(k)(4)(D));

 - placements in in-school suspension or out-of-school suspension and incidents of expulsion (§37.115(k)(3)(F));
 - In prior years, LEAs reported the total number of discipline incidents that included a Safe and Supportive Schools Program (SSP) team review and the resulting total number of changes in school placement that occurred after the SSP review was conducted through an annual data collection/survey.

Texas School for the Deaf (TSD), Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired (TSBVI), and Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) (formerly TYC): Students who are enrolled in the TSD and the TSBVI will be shown in attendance (reported as TOTAL-INELIGIBLE-DAYS-PRESENT) for the period of time that they are in attendance at either school. Sending LEAs will report attendance data on these students for the period(s) of time during the school year that the student is in attendance at the sending LEA.

PEIMS Extended Year Submission (4):

When reporting basic attendance data for the Additional Days School Year (ADSY) Program, use REPORTING-PERIOD-INDICATOR-CODE "9". The instruction for an ADSY program can be provided on a campus that is different from the campus in which a student is enrolled. The campus in which the student is enrolled during the current school year, or the last campus in which the student was enrolled prior to attending the ADSY Program, is required to meet the ADSY calendar requirements of 180 days and 75,600 minutes.

TOTAL-DAYS-ABSENT (E0036) indicates the total number of days the student was absent during a particular reporting period.

For the PEIMS Extended Year Submission (4), TOTAL-DAYS-ABSENT should be reported as half-day absences in the Additional Day School Year Program.

How would an LEA report the PEIMS Summer Submission if the school year ends after the due date?

If an LEA closes after the PEIMS Summer First Submission, they will need to complete the first submission and then do a resubmission to correct (add) any data. If they close after the PEIMS Summer Resubmission or are a year-round school, they will receive an extension.





How should ADSY attendance be reported when an LEA has ADSY days scheduled during the school year?

Regardless of when the ADSY days are offered, ADSY attendance is reported in the PEIMS Extended Year Submission for the associated academic year.





Can an LEA add eight ADSY days to the start of their regular calendar to meet the 180-day calendar requirement?

No. The LEA cannot add ADSY days to the start of their regular calendar to meet the 180-day calendar requirement. The regular board-approved calendar must demonstrate 180-days of instruction and 75,600 minutes, distinct from the ADSY days.





Why are TOTAL-DAYS-ABSENT (E0036) being removed from the PEIMS Extended Year Submission?

TEA removed TOTAL-DAYS-ABSENT (E0036) as the ADSY program is funded on the days the student participates in the program.





Why are EXCESS-HOURS-IN-INSTRUCTIONAL-SETTING (E0945) being removed from the PEIMS Extended Year Submission?

TEA removed EXCESS-HOURS-IN-INSTRUCTIONAL-SETTING (E0945) because the ADSY program only reports data for students in grades PK-5. This grade range of students is not eligible to participate in CTE and therefore would not earn excess contact hours in their instructional setting.





When does TEA calculate the CTE indicator code?

The CTE Indicator Code is calculated after each submission is completed. The CTE auto-calculation process is run after the close of the PEIMS Summer First Submission, Resubmission and year-round schools' submission. It is then calculated again after the close of PEIMS Extended Year First Submission and Resubmission.





When will the 2022-2023 CTE weighted tiers table be available for the new CTE service IDs?

The CTE department will publish an updated weighted tiers table for the 2022-2023 school year in April/May 2023.





When will the 2022-2023 CTE crosswalk be available?

The CTE auto-calculation look-up tables are updated for the current school year at the beginning of April. For example, TEA will update the 2022-2023 CTE auto-calculation look-up tables in April 2023.





Would the VIRTUAL-STUDENT-NOT-IN-MEMBERSHIP(E1735) indicator be reported in the PEIMS Summer Submission for a student that was reported as ADA-ELIGIBILITY-CODE (E0787) "9" in the PEIMS Fall Submission but changed to ADA "1" during the second semester?

The VIRTUAL-STUDENT-NOT-IN-MEMBERSHIP (E1735) should be reported for a student who spends at least half of their instructional time enrolled in virtual courses without the benefit of funding under ADA (ADA-ELIGIBILITY-CODE "9"). Depending on the LEA calendar, a student reported under this scenario may not need the indicator. If the student was enrolled in virtual courses without the benefit of funding under ADA for less than half their instruction time, the indicator would not be reported.

Overview

• During the 87th legislative session, Senate Bill (SB) 1888 was passed, which amends TEC§ 28.0253. As a result, the Texas Education Agency (TEA), in coordination with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), shall establish the Texas First Early High School Completion Program. This program allows public high school students who demonstrate early readiness for college to graduate early from high school.



- Overview cont.
 - To be eligible for an award under the program, a student must:
 - Be a resident of this state as determined by THECB rules;
 - Have graduated early from high school under the Texas First Early High School Completion Program; and
 - Completed the Financial Aid Application Requirement for High School Graduation (TEC§ 28.0256).



- Overview cont.
 - THECB shall award a grant (state credit) to pay for tuition, mandatory fees, and other costs of attendance at an institution to each eligible student based on if the student graduates two or more semesters or less than two semesters or the equivalent earlier than the student's high school cohort.
 - TEA will increase a district's average daily attendance for students who graduated early under the Texas First High School Completion Program and are enrolled at an eligible institution.
 - TEA will also reduce each district's FSP entitlement by the amount granted (state credit) to each eligible student.

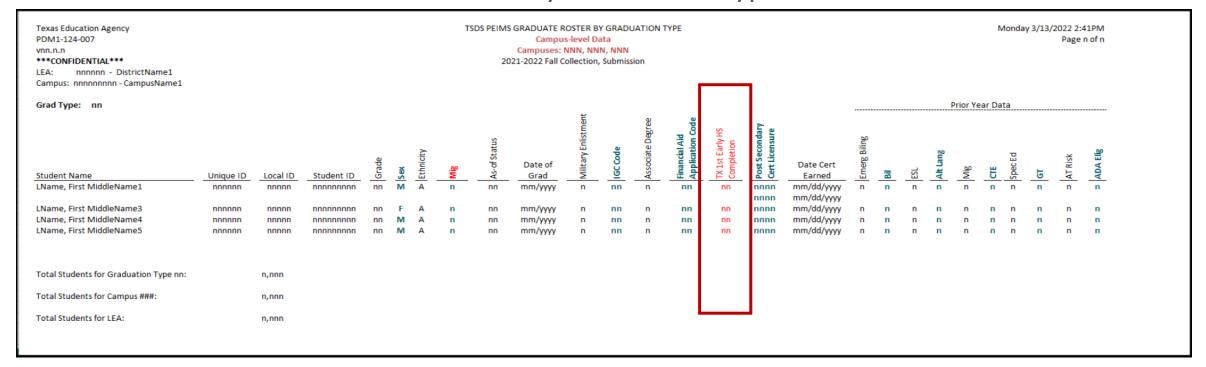

Adult HS Charter School Pgm - Data Element Updates



Overview

• During the 87th legislative session, Senate Bill (SB) 1615 was passed, which amended Chapter 12 of the TEC by adding Subchapter G, "Adult High School Charter School Program." Additionally, SB 1615 transferred existing TEC sections 29.259(j) and (k) to Subchapter G, Chapter 12, TEC§ 12.263, Adult Education Program Funding. Under Section 12.263, any student attending an adult high school charter school program may be eligible for funding under the state compensatory education (SCE) allotment. The Excel Center (For Adults) is the only charter currently operating under TEC§ 29.259.



Adult HS Charter School Pgm - Data Element Updates -2 tsds



- Overview cont.
 - Currently, TEA collects a STUDENT-CENSUS-BLOCK-GROUP (E1648) for all economically disadvantaged students enrolled as of the PEIMS Fall snapshot date (last Friday in October) and is reported in the PEIMS Fall Submission to calculate the SCE allotment funding. However, the changes in SB 1615 allow any economically disadvantaged student attending an adult high school charter school program to be included in the calculations for SCE allotment funding regardless of enrollment date. Therefore, for TEA to calculate the appropriate SCE allotment funding, the STUDENT-CENSUS-BLOCK-GROUP (E1648) must be collected for any economically disadvantaged student who attended a charter operating under TEC §29.259 at any time during the school year.

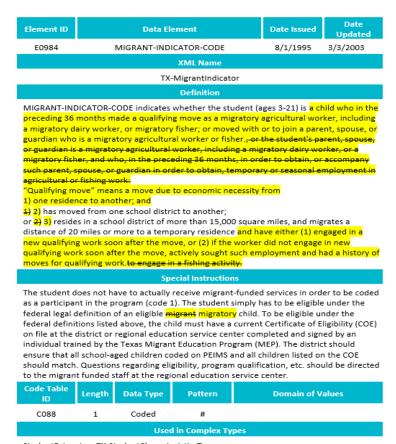

MIGRANT-INDICATOR-CODE (E0984) indicates whether the student (ages 3-21) is a child who in the preceding 36 months made a qualifying move as a migratory agricultural worker, including a migratory dairy worker, or migratory fisher; or moved with or to join a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migratory agricultural worker or fisher., or the student's parent, spouse, or guardian is a migratory agricultural worker, including a migratory dairy worker, or a migratory fisher, and who, in the preceding 36 months, in order to obtain, or accompany such parent, spouse, or guardian in order to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work: "Qualifying move" means a move due to economic necessity from

- 1) one residence to another: and
- 1) as moved from one school district to another;

or 2/3) resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence and have either (1) engaged in a new qualifying work soon after the move, or (2) if the worker did not engage in new qualifying work soon after the move, actively sought such employment and had a history of moves for qualifying work. to engage in a fishing activity.

The MIGRANT-INDICATOR-CODE identifies every migrant migratory student enrolled in any LEA in the state. A migrant migratory student should be reported with MIGRANT-INDICATOR CODE of 1 whether the district receives migrant funds or not.

A migrant student does not have to actually receive migrant-funded services in order to be coded as a participant in the program (MIGRANT-INDICATOR-CODE = 1). The student simply has to be eligible under the federal legal definition of an eligible migrant migratory child.

Migrant Migratory students who have a MIGRANT-INDICATOR-CODE of 1 must have a current Certificate of Eligibility (COE) on file at the LEA or regional education service center completed and signed by an individual trained by the Texas Migrant Education Program (MEP). The LEA should ensure that all school-aged students coded as Migrant for PEIMS should match all children listed on the COE. Questions regarding eligibility, program qualification, etc. should be directed to the migrant funded staff at the regional education service center.

Migrant Migratory students ages 3-21 who are enrolled in school in campus-based programs, but who have not yet received a high school diploma are coded 1. Migrant students ages three and four, who are enrolled in home-based early childhood programs, should be coded as "enrolled, but not in membership (ADA-ELIGIBILITY-CODE 0)".

Note that migrant migratory students ages 5-21 who are not enrolled in school (what the Migrant Education Program calls residency-only students) are not reported in PEIMS.

FASRG Updates



Overview

On September 7, 2022, the Financial Compliance Division released the Financial Accountability System Resource Guide (FASRG) version 18.0. The change included removing three program intent codes, Pre-Kindergarten (32), Pre-Kindergarten – Compensatory Education (34), and Pre-Kindergarten – Bilingual Education (35), from being used for budget, payroll, and contracted instructional (CI) staff for the 2022-2023 school year.

The College, Career, and Military Preparation Division maintains the translations in the CAREER-AND-TECHNICAL-ED-IND-CD (C142) and has requested changes to help clarify the codes.

Working Submissions – Department Actions



- State Funding
 - Updates that would impact ADA/FTE calculations
 - State Funding informs the LEA via email that they must hire an independent auditor to perform an audit of the PEIMS attendance data and confirm that amendments are needed **before** the TEA will make the amendments.
 - The auditor should be familiar with LEA attendance reporting procedures and conduct a comprehensive review/audit of all the district's attendance data, including the data for which a revision is sought.

Working Submissions – Department Actions (cont.)



- Federal Fiscal Compliance and Reporting Division
 - Updates that impact Enrollment, Title I, and Economic Disadvantaged Counts
 - Federal Fiscal Compliance uses this data to supersede the data found in the final certified tables for reporting (before the federal reporting deadlines).
- Research and Analysis
 - Updates that impact Graduate, Leaver, Course Completion, and IBC counts
 - Research and Analysis does not use the actual working submission data to update datasets or public reporting.
 - May assist in explaining data flagged as potentially erroneous by USED during EDFacts submission.



Working Submissions – Department Actions (cont.)



- Performance Reporting
 - Updates that impact Course Completion and IBC Counts
 - Performance Reporting does not use the Working Submission data for accountability or reporting purposes.
 - Please see the PR FAQ:

Question: Do accountability calculations include data from the PEIMS working collection?

Answer: No, Performance Reporting only uses data submitted during the official PEIMS submission and resubmission windows. Data submitted in the working collection is not used for accountability calculations.



Working Submissions – Self-Reported Data Unit tsds

- The Self-Reported Data Unit (SRDU) directed by Brittany Wright aims to improve the quality of the self-reported data the agency receives from LEAs. The unit:
 - Collaborates with TEA divisions who have identified data anomalies and helps investigate those anomalies further, addresses data-related complaints submitted by external stakeholders, and conducts independent research to identify potential data concerns.
 - SRDU may issue compliance review letters to LEAs when potential data concerns are identified. Compliance reviews are a collaborative review process with LEAs to ensure they are acting in accordance with state law and other regulatory requirements. TEA requests documentation and other information by a particular deadline to review and determine whether there has been a violation and commonly works with the LEAs to bring them into compliance and/or to establish better local practices.



Working Submissions – SRDU (cont.)



- At the conclusion of any reviews, SRDU works with relevant agency staff to improve the internal processes with the goal of ensuring LEAs have the information and tools necessary to accurately report data to the agency.
- SRDU and Working Submissions:
 - As part of the process of identifying LEAs with anomalous data, SRDU uses the Working Submission information to identify whether an LEA has already selfidentified and corrected an issue with their data submission(s).
 - SRDU may use the Working Submission information to issue "informational" letters to LEAs that explain importance of submitting accurate and timely data to the agency and provide resources to improve future data submissions.
 - SRDU may also use the Working Submission information to issue compliance review letters to LEAs that seem to have systemic issues with reporting accurate, complete, and timely information to the agency.
